Ask the iconic Lonnie Krahn about how he got involved with volunteering for ringette, and he will tell you he just put his hand up at the wrong time. His daughter was only 5 years old and they needed someone to schedule the ice.

Provincial Championship. An impressive resume already includes four City Championships, Properties Ringette Association President for the last five years, Past President four years previous and coached the last nine years.

Spring of 1996, Lonnie and the Properties Ringette Association started the Properties Spring Classic Ringette Tournament in their new home, Don Hartman Northeast Sportsplex, and on the 10th anniversary, in the 2004-05 season the name was changed to the Lonnie Krahn Spring Classic

September of 2005 Governor General Norm Kwong presented Lonnie the Alberta Centennial Award. A well-deserved award as Lonnie had by this time coached ringette for 18 years and coached fastball for 14 years and tirelessly served on various boards and committees.

In the spring of 2012, Lonnie watched his grandson play his first of two years in ringette. It was a very emotional moment for Lonnie. This would also be the last year Lonnie would be actively organizing the Spring Classic and the following season, the tournament was moved to the fall and is now known as the Lonnie Krahn Classic.

In 2001 Lonnie was asked why he does it. He replies: "For the love of the game and the participants."





- Since 1990 a world ringette championship has been held every year.
- Canada and Finland hold the record number of championships
- There is a Ringette Hall of Fame recognizing outstanding achievement in the sport and contributions to its development.
- The Canada Winter Games have hosted a ringette tournament since 1991.

Sam Jacks

A man called Sam Jacks invented ringette.

Jacks came to Canada from Scotland in 1920.

He became a sports director in North Bay, Ontario.

There were many outdoor skating rinks in the small town.

The boys were active, but girls did not play hockey.

Jacks wanted girls to play a game on ice, too.

So, he invented a skating game for girls.

Ringette is born.

At first, the girls cut off the ends of old hockey sticks. They used a hollow rubber ring instead of a hockey puck. Slowly Jacks made rules.

He called the game "ringette".

In 1963 in Ontario, girls played the first ringette game. Now players use a straight stick with a special tip. They pass and shoot the ring to score points or goals.

A safe team sport.

Ringette is a very fast game.

A player must pass the ring across a blue line

to move it down the ice.

This teaches teamwork.

Ringette is a non-contact sport.

No one can tackle another player.

A player wears pads, gloves and a helmet.

All players learn about safety on the ice.



Tournament Rules

- 1. The official rules of **Ringette Alberta** apply.
- In the case of conflict in uniform color, the VISITING team must change their uniforms.
- 3. In medal games, the higher place team shall be the **HOME** team.
- 4. Teams must declare **Goaltender(s)**, **Captains** and **Alternate Captains** on the game sheet by indicating **(G)**, **(C)**, **(AC)**.
- Good sportsmanship and fair play will be stressed throughout the tournament.
- Any TEAM accumulating MORE THAN 30 Penalty Minutes in any ONE (1)
 GAME, shall see the Head Coach or acting Head Coach from that game suspended for their next tournament game. No grievances will be accepted.
- 7. A **MATCH penalty** will automatically result in suspension from all subsequent tournament games.
- Game scores will be displayed on the time clock, posted in arenas, and recorded for tie breaking procedures, with a MAXIMUM SEVEN GOAL difference
- 9. Teams using affiliates are required to strike the names of players who are not participating in a game from the gamesheet to ensure proper verification. When using an affiliate the name(s) of the player(s) and their jersey number must be written in the appropriate space on the gamesheet, marked with (AP) for Affiliate Player and (AG) for Affiliate Goalie.

From the Ringette Alberta 5.0 – Player Affiliation Policy. 5.4.3 Players "dressed" and listed on the game sheet shall be:

- A minimum of seven (7) players
- A maximum of five (5) affiliate players

- A maximum of twelve (12) players if the only affiliate player(s) participating in the game are skater(s)
- A maximum of thirteen (13) players if a combination of affiliate skater(s) and an affiliate goaltender is participating in the game
- A maximum of eighteen (18) if the only affiliate player "dressed" is a qoaltender "Players" include goaltenders and skaters
- 10. Teams must be ready to go on ice ten (10) minutes before the scheduled game time. Teams not iced within two (2) minutes of the referee's whistle being blown to start the game will forfeit the game. However, the game will be played as an exhibition game and the score recorded as 4-0. The penalty for not playing a game is forfeiture of position in the Round Robin standings.
- 11. All players must be from one team and must be registered as a member of that team with the applicable Provincial or Zone governing body. Teams who play an ineligible player will have the actual result of the affected game(s) cancelled. The affected game(s) will be recorded as 4-0 score in favour of the team(s) **not** playing an ineligible player.
- 12. Overage players will only be allowed if they are registered with the participating team. Teams must follow Ringette Alberta Overage Player Policy.
- 13. All teams <u>MUST</u> sign in and pick up a Coach's Package at the Tournament's arena control desk at the Don Hartman North East Sportsplex prior to their first scheduled game.
- 14. Score sheets are to be picked up at the Tournament's arena control desk. They are to be completed or verified and signed by the coach at least fifteen (15) minutes prior to game time and returned to the control desk.
 IMPORTANT: Please <u>bring your own team labels</u> for scoresheets.
 We will <u>NOT</u> supply printed scoresheets.
- 15. Any team that leaves the ice, or calls a game will be suspended from all further play in the tournament, including the awarding of medallions.
- 16. Thirty second (30 sec) shot clocks will be used in U12 and older Divisions in this Tournament.



- 17. Any team wishing to file a protest may do so by submitting their request in writing, along with \$200, to the Tournament Committee. Notification of a protest must be received within one hour of the incident occurring to enable sufficient time to deal with the protest.
- A grievance committee will meet to deal with any protests received. (If the
 protest is upheld the \$200 will be refunded). No game protests involving
 referee judgement will be accepted. THE REFEREE'S DECISION SHALL BE
 FINAL.

Games Duration and Format:

IMPORTANT: Officials have been instructed to drop the clock to 2 minutes "Stop Time" when there is 5 minutes left in ice time <u>for Round Robin games only</u>. Clock <u>will not</u> be dropped for Final games.

U12 & U14: Two (2) periods of 18 minutes stop time with shot clock play. Top 2 teams in each division standing will participate in medal game.

U16 and above: Two (2) periods of 20 minutes stop time with shot clock play. Top 2 teams in each division standing will participate in medal game.

Halftime break will be 2 minutes running time.

Round Robin Team Standing Rules

POINT STRUCTURE

Teams receive two (2) points for a win, one (1) point for a tie, and no (0) points for a loss. At the completion of round robin play, teams will be ranked according to the total points in all games played.

Breaking of Ties in Team Standings

Note: Regardless of game score, only a **SEVEN goal difference** will be applied

When two or more teams have an equal number of points after round robin play, the teams will be ranked according to the following rules:

- A. The winner of more game(s) between each other during the round robin will be declared the highest position.
- B. If still tied, teams shall be ranked according to the difference between goals for and against in games between the <u>tied teams</u> in round robin play. The team with the highest positive difference shall be ranked highest, the team with the second highest positive difference shall be ranked next, the team with the third highest positive difference shall be ranked next, etc.
- C. If still tied, teams shall be ranked according to the least goals against in games <u>between the tied teams</u> in round robin play. The team with the least goals against shall be declared the highest position, the team with the second least goals against shall be next, the team with the third least goals against shall be next, etc.
- D. If still tied, teams shall be ranked according to the difference between goals for and against in <u>all games</u> played in the round robin. The team with the highest positive difference shall be ranked highest, the team with the second highest positive difference shall be ranked next, the team with the third highest positive difference shall be ranked next, etc.
- E. If still tied, teams shall be ranked according to the least goals against in <u>all</u> <u>games</u> played in the round robin. The team with the least goals against shall be declared the highest position, the team with the second least goals against shall be next, the team with the third least goals against shall be next, etc.
- F. If still tied, teams shall be ranked according to the highest ratio of goals for divided by the sum of goals for plus goals against for games between the tied teams in round robin play. The team with the highest ratio shall be ranked highest, the team with the second highest ratio shall be ranked next, the team with the third highest ratio shall be ranked next, etc.

Total goals for + Total goals against Total goals against

G. If still tied, teams shall be ranked according to the highest ratio of goals for divided by the sum of goals for plus goals against for all games played in the round robin. The team with the highest ratio shall be ranked highest, the team with the second highest ratio shall be ranked next, the team with the third highest ratio shall be ranked next, etc.



- H. If still tied, teams shall be ranked according to the least total penalty minutes for all games played in the round robin. The team with the least penalty minutes shall be declared the highest position, the team with the second least penalty minutes shall be next, the team with the third least penalty minutes shall be next, etc.
- If still tied, teams shall be ranked according to the time required to score
 their first goal for all games played in the round robin. The team scoring the
 earliest goal shall be ranked highest, the team scoring the second earliest
 goal shall be ranked next, the team scoring the third earliest goal shall be
 ranked next, etc.
- J. If still tied, teams shall be ranked by a coin toss.

NOTE: Each step of the tie breaking rules shall apply to all teams involved in the tie.

ie. according to rule B, the White team has a difference of 5 goals, the Red team has a difference of 3 goals and the Blue team has a difference of 2 goals. White team shall be ranked highest, Red team next and Blue team shall be third among these tied teams.

If three (3) or more teams are involved in the tie, the tie breaking procedure shall only revert to A if teams are still tied after the application of subsequent rules. ie. according to rule B, the White team has a difference of 5 goals, the Red team and the Blue team are still tied at 3 goals difference. White team shall be ranked highest, revert to rule A to break the tie between the Red & Blue teams.

Breaking of Tie Scores in Tournament Games

- If a ROUND ROBIN game is tied at the end of regulation time, each team will be awarded (1) one point.
- If a game is tied at the end of the second half of a QUARTER-FINAL,
 SEMI-FINAL or FINAL GAME, in the event of a tie score at the end of regulation time in a Final Game:
 - A 2 minute break will be taken, followed by a five-minute, sudden victory overtime period. Each team will submit a list of five shooters for a potential initial shoot-out to the on-ice official at this time & prior to overtime play.
 - Teams will not change ends for the overtime period.
 - Ring possession for the start of the overtime period will be determined by coin toss.
 - If a tie still exists at the end of the overtime period, a five player shoot-out will decide the game winner. Home team shall shoot first.

- Using the submitted shoot list, shooters will alternate, beginning with the designated home team.
- The team that scores the greatest number of goals will be declared the winner.
- If a tie still exists after the initial five player shoot-out, a single shootout, alternating format will begin with the designated home team.
- The coach will select players for each round, but cannot re-use players until all players have taken their turn in the shoot-out. Goalies and injured players are exempt.
- The first team that scores in a round when the other does not will be the winner.
- If the score is still tied at the end of the allotted time slot, a coin toss will determine the winner.


NOTE: Penalties assessed in regulation or overtime play shall carry-over to the next period.

Time-Outs:


Each team is entitled to ONE 30-second timeout per regulation game. Each team is entitled to ONE additional 30-second timeout in overtime.

COVID-19 Updates

The City of Calgary Vaccine Passport Bylaw 65M2021 requires many businesses and organizations to require proof of vaccination, recent negative COVID-19 test, or valid medical exemption letter to gain entry.

User groups are responsible for ensuring all their participants 12 years and older (players and officials) meet the proof of vaccine requirements.

- Spectators will be screened for bylaw requirements to enter (vaccination, negative test or medical exemption requirements)
- Proof and vaccination (or exemption, or negative test as per the bylaw)
 and personal identification should be carried with each participant
- As per Provincial Order and Municipal Bylaw 63M2021 face coverings are required in all indoor public spaces (with the exception of participants on the playing surface)

Proof of vaccination

Your proof of vaccination must display the name, type of vaccine and the date it was received. This can be a paper COVID-19 vaccination record or shown on an electronic device from:

- Alberta Health Services
- A First Nation
- Your pharmacy
- Your physician
- Another province or territory
- Canadian armed forces



Proof of negative test result

You can show a COVID-19 negative test result. Tests must be:

- Provided as an original or printed copy (photos are not sufficient)
 Privately-paid
- A Health Canada approved rapid antigen, rapid PCR or lab-based PCR test
- Completed within the past 72 hours

Test results must show the type of test, time of sample collection, clear indication of a negative result, and laboratory that completed the test.

Tests must not be from Alberta Health Services or Alberta Precision Laboratories.

Medical exemption from vaccine letter

You must show an original signed letter from a physician or nurse practitioner that includes:

- Your name that matches your identification (only required for adults 18 & over)
- Physician's or nurse practitioner's complete information, including their name, phone #, contact information, professional registration number & signature
- A statement that there is a medical reason for not being fully vaccinated against COVID-19
- The duration that the exemption is valid

Dosage requirements for vaccination

- **Between Sept. 20 to Oct. 25:** proof of a single dose is accepted if you received the dose more than two weeks before entering the facility.
- After October 25: proof of double vaccination (or single Janssen dose) with the final dose administered at least 14 days prior to entry is required for all customers 12 years and older to access our recreation facility.
